| Healthy Human Race (Cindy)                       | Registrations are going well. Strong registrations in the past 2 weeks. We are approaching 400 registrations so we might hit 500 registrations. We now have 2 golf carts from Soldiers Field for the med team, but we will rent 1 for Mark Bongers. We need a few more pins for age group awards. Final details are going into place. 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| All Comers Meets (Dale)                    | Pizza party was held at Pasquale's for the volunteers. A gift card, bottle of champagne and a personalized RTC Jacket were presented to Jerry in recognition of 40 years of being the All-Comers' starter.  Total # of children who participated in one or more meets was 879 children. There was good attendance at each of the six meets. June 28th meet was canceled due to weather, but a makeup meet was held on July 26th for a total of 6 Tuesday night meets. Dale would like to purchase a new banner for next year.   |
| Women's 4-Mile Race (agenda notation only) | There were 57 finishers for the Women's 4-mile race. Lin wrote a heartfelt thank you note to the runners and volunteers for their participation. The race made a profit of \$265.89.  |
| Reggie Oeltjen Douglas Trail 11-Mile Race  | 64 Online Registrations, 10 race day registrations. We had 10 no shows. Weather was cloudy, 79 degrees at race start with 93% humidity. 64 runners started and finished the race with no medical incidents. Steps were taken to make sure there was adequate ice on the course and cold water was provided to the runners immediately upon finishing. Watermelon was also put on ice. Trader Joe's donated bananas and strawberry cereal bars. HyVee donated 72 bags of Old Dutch Potato Chips and Scheels donated the 4 headbands for the awards. Thank-you notes were delivered to the sponsors. Natalie Droessler (Reggie's daughter) ran the race for her 5th consecutive year. Her 16-year-old son Brett (Reggie's grandson) ran this year and finished the longest distance race he had ever ran. We had a runner from Hong Kong in the US for the summer and a runner from NY visiting as well as several runners from WI. Volunteers stepped up during the last week before the race and we had good volunteer support for the race. Race Income was higher than budgeted and expenses were less than budgeted. Race Profit of \$662.30, more than double what was projected. Sonja Kranz, Co-Race Director for the past 7 years, resigned in January 2022. Gwen Jacobson (Co-Race Director for 7 years, Race Director for 2022) has turned this race over to Brock Quimby, Race Director and will support the race director as needed in 2023. |

## **RRC Awards**

Proposed changes to the Annual Awards: Runner of the Year (ROY):

- It is not stated in the current criteria if ROY needs to be an RRC member or not. The workgroup would like to make it explicit that the ROY does not need to be a RRC member but should be a member of the Rochester-area community.
- We will continue to offer a jacket of the ROY's choice from Superior Screeners, but we will provide Superior Screeners with a budget for the jacket (budget amount TBD but it would be the average of the past few years, roughly \$165 for both the jacket and personalization). We will ask Superior Screeners to provide guidance if the winner hits the budget limit.
- In the case of a tie ROY vote from the RRC Board of Directors, ROY can be awarded to 2 runners.
- The workgroup would like to remove the criteria "must be separated by 3 or more years."
- The board would like to keep the criteria to make the award once every 3 years.

Service Awards (Dwight Pierson and Outstanding Service)

- Past winners will no longer be expected to choose the next year's winners. The Board (or a workgroup from the Board) can do this using data from Sign-Up Genius and board knowledge of significant service contributions. Race directors will also be invited to provide insight for volunteers who have provided significant service.
- Rather than ordering trophies for service winners, we will let service winners choose RRC merchandise from the RRC Storefront or give them a gift card valued up to \$100.

## New Award: The Resiliency Award

- This new award will go to a runner who inspires the local running community for admirable persistence or coming back from an injury. This award might go to someone who is a middle-of-the-pack runner who consistently shows up with a smile and positive attitude or a runner who has returned to running following an injury.
- Nominations for the Resiliency Award will be requested with nominations for ROY from the running community. The winner will be voted upon by the Board.
