Results of the 15th Annual Bear Creek Handicap 6-Mile on Nov.5th.

For the first time in the Bear Creek Run history the race was changed from 7 miles to 6 miles. Due to the flood control project, the bear creek trails were dug up and we didn't think anyone would want to run cross country and still try to accomplish keep their predicted time. The out and back course on Pinewood Road proved to be a nice run with at least 14 runners who finished within one minute of their predicted times. Only four runners disqualified themselves by finishing ahead of their predicted time, while the rest of the 44 finished behind their predicted time. This past Saturday, the Rochester Track Club sponsored the 17th Annual Bear Creek 7-Mile Handicap Run and for the first time in history no one was disqualified. The Bear Creek run is based on the philosophy that anyone can win, but you can't run too fast. Every runner predicts how long they believe it will take them to run seven miles. According to their predicted time, the runners start at staggered intervals so theoretically everyone would finish at the same time. Therefore, whether you are a rookie or a veteran runner you can win this race if you finish closest to your predicted finish time. If you run faster than your predicted time you are disqualified.

Even though the temperature was hovering around a cool 20 degrees, 40 runners showed up to try their luck (or skill) predicting their times without the aid of a watch. The overall winner was a surprised Laura Sandness who finished 29 seconds over her predicted time of 49:30. The top 26 runners finished within two minutes of their predicted time.
