

It was a warm afternoon as the 1997 Mayo Open Cross Country race returned to the hilly Eastwood Golf Course, following the 1996 detour to the Roy Watson complex. So, after the high school races on Friday, September 12th, Jerry Wille made it fore (golf lingo) wins in a row, coming from behind to post a time of 16:41, a new master's record for the Eastwood course. Christopher Babcock, after a blazing 5:05 first mile in his first appearance at this event, held on for second place in 17:19. First female finisher was Nancy Marquette in 20:16, which would have been a 40-49 age group record if she wasn't only 39 (that was Jack Benny's problem too!).
